BEATING THE DRUMS OF WAR WILL DAMAGE ETHIOPIA

The regime in Addis Abeba, which has always acted against the interests of Ethiopia and her people, is now feverishly beating the drum of war against Egypt on the issue of the Nile and the so called Renaissance Dam which it wants to call the Meles Dam to honor the late tyrant detested by most Ethiopians.

At issue is not the right on the use of the Nile by all the Riparian States and Ethiopia as the source of the Blue Nile. It is also clear that Egypt has to negotiate with all the concerned States and cannot be stubbornly pushing its own interest above every other country. The regime in Addis Abeba has already misappropriated the so called bond fund and is trying to bleed and fleece the people further. There is always the path of negotiation and peaceful resolution of potential conflicts. Propagating jingoistic propaganda and boasting of one's nonexistent military prowess is courting disaster. The regime in Addis Abeba is truly irresponsible.

The people of Ethiopia and Egypt are not enemies and they do not need war. The Nile should be sued by all the source and riparian states and should not be used as a political pretext to achieve shady political objectives that has, at least, nothing to do with the interest of the Ethiopian people.
